DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEMBERS-AT-LARGE

Authority

The bylaws of the Federal Laboratory Consortium for Technology Transfer (FLC) provide the authority for Members-at-Large (MALs) (Article V, Section 3 c.)).

Purpose

The purpose of a MAL is to represent the general membership and to aid in governing the Consortium.

Election

• Eligibility for Office

Eligibility for election as a nationally elected officer shall be limited to Laboratory Representatives, Agency Representatives, and Consortium participants.

• Frequency of Election

MALs shall be elected every two years in conjunction with the national meeting.

Three MALs shall be elected in odd-numbered years.

Three MALs shall be elected in even-numbered years.

• Approval of Candidacy

The nomination of a MAL must be approved by the nominee's organization of employment.

Responsibility

MALs shall:

- 1. Serve as voting members of the Executive Board (EB).
- 2. Chair ad hoc committees at the discretion of the Consortium Chair or Vice-Chair.
- 3. Assist the Regional Coordinator of the region in which they are located.
- 4. Participate in FLC regional and national technology transfer activities as appropriate.
- 5. Serve on at least one Standing Committee.
- 6. Submit a joint quarterly report on their activities in the quarterly report format.
